<p>Through dramatic play children are learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take on roles and responsibilities through creative storytelling • Extend on familiar script • Add to their prior learning • Be creative and let their imaginations to take over • Explore group entry skills, turn taking skills and negotiating • Communicate with each other • Extend on familiar text • Take risks with dramatic performance in a safe and supportive space • Use puppets to explore characters 	<p>As children engage in visual arts they are learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lines – Straight, curvy, diagonal, thick and thin • Shape – 2D, 3D • Texture – Shading, Light, Dark, Smooth, Rough • Colours – Mixing, Primary, Secondary • Material manipulation • To extend on their imaginations • Creative representations 	<p>In music children will explore:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Beat • Notes • Tempo • Rhythm • Piano skills – scales, half tone, full tone, reading notes • Singing pitch • Songs • Introduction to musical instruments 	<p>In our dance space children are learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To extend on their gross motor skills (Loco motor, directionality, levels, skipping, jumping, hopping, balance) • Explore numeracy skills (Counting beats of 8 for choreography) • Hand eye coordination • Different dance styles (Ballet, hip hop, jazz, latin, yoga) • Self confidence • Choreography – Seasonal concerts • To dance as a coordinated team
